

RESOLUTION NO. 11-02

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF WILLIAMS,
CALIFORNIA ESTABLISHING APPLICATION AND PUBLIC SERVICE
FEES FOR SPECIAL EVENT PERMITS**

WHEREAS, the City of Williams has adopted Ordinance No. 171-09 Adding Chapter 9.16 to the Williams Municipal Code Relating to Special Events; and

WHEREAS, Sections 9.16.050D of Ordinance 171-09 provides that the City Council shall adopt application fees for special event permits by resolution; and

WHEREAS, , Sections 9.16.140B of Ordinance 171-09 provides that the City Council shall adopt public services fees for specified special event permits by resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Williams:

1. **Incorporation of Recitals.** The City Council hereby finds and determines that the Recitals of this Resolution are true and correct and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution as though fully set forth herein.

2. **Adoption.** The City Council hereby establishes special event permit application and public services fees as set forth in the attached Exhibit "A."

3. **Effective Date.** This Resolution shall be effective as of the date of its adoption.

Exhibit "A"
Fee Schedule

Application Fee: Special event permit applicants shall be charged a \$50.00 nonrefundable fee due at the time the application is submitted to the Police Department.

Public Services Fees: Applicable special event permit holders shall be charged public services fees calculated based on the actual number of staff hours provided and the applicable employee hourly cost in effect at the time of the event. The City may require special event permit applicants to pay a deposit equal to the estimated cost of the applicable public services fees.
